Rehabilitation Counselling Education (M. A.)

The Master's degree in Rehabilitation Counselling Education is a demand-oriented and future-oriented professional qualification for educators working at inpatient and outpatient healthcare facilities. It aims to improve care for people with impairments and disabilities.

Students learn to describe and analyse complex problems and to translate specialist theoretical and research knowledge into practical action. On this basis, they acquire competences in various rehabilitation educational fields, e.g. in research, evaluation, training, development, planning, organisation and management. Graduates have a critical understanding of the key theories, principles and methods of rehabilitation education and are able to further intensify their knowledge vertically, horizontally and laterally.

Career opportunities

The degree programme prepares students for careers in non-school special-needs and rehabilitation education, e.g.:

- Inpatient or outpatient children's and youth welfare clinics
- Occupational rehabilitation or integration of people with health impairments
- Neuro-rehabilitation facilities
- (Rehabilitation) facilities for people with disabilities/senior care homes
- Academic career (PhD)

Specialisation

Teaching is based on research, and there are cooperation agreements with outpatient rehabilitation centres as well as various doctor's surgeries. Students have the opportunity to acquire practical and research-relevant skills during these cooperation projects. They can also get to know how theory is translated into practice with instruction from professionals with various specialisations.

This can be in the area of child and youth psychotherapy or in rehabilitation facilities for adults.

Period abroad

Students have the option of spending one semester at one of more than 20 partner universities with (special needs and rehabilitation) education programmes.
